#### **Reflection Fr Adrian**

Today Shane, Cody and Linda complete the journey into the church which we know by the name RCIA, the acronym for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults last year. I and the other members of the RCIA community in the parish have been honoured to walk with them on this part of their life journey. Shane and Cody will be fully initiated: baptised, confirmed and receive Our Lord in Holy Communion. Linda, baptised many years ago, will complete her initiation with confirmation and reception of communion.

We came to know each other as each week we gathered and learned what the Church was and how it makes Christ present in our age as it has done since the time of Christ. We are not abandoned orphans. The words Jesus spoke to the young Pharisee Saul is the truth: why are you persecuting me? In other words, I, Jesus, live in these people who follow me.

On reflection, the words spoken at a baptism are extraordinary: I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The word "baptise" means immerse. Soldiers going into combat speak of a baptism of fire. They are immersed in the action. Christian baptism is actually saying I immerse you in the inner life of God who is Father, Son and Spirit. That action makes a change in the depths of the one baptised which cannot be reversed. The one baptised is changed in the very depths of their being. They become someone they were not before. Christ lives in them and identifies with them.

At a baptism as with all the sacraments Christ is the central figure acting in the life of the person being baptised, confirmed, given communion, freed from their sins, anointed for healing or sent to create community as married or ordained. At baptism, Christ chooses us and commissions us to go and bear fruit that will nourish other people. As He said: You did not choose me, no I chose you. With infants, believing parents seek immersion in the Trinity as the best thing they can ask God for their child. They then give themselves to be sure the children know what our Lord did for them by raising them in the practice of the faith.

With our friends, Shane and Cody, their baptism is their acknowledgment of Our Lord's choice of them as disciples. Along with Linda, they will all be sealed with the Spirit who was the gift Jesus breathed on the disciples on Easter Sunday night (John's gospel) and then they will process with the rest of us to be treated like guests by Our Lord and receive from Him the bread of life and the cup of salvation.

Our hope had been to baptise Cody and Shane by immersion in the waters of the font, but this cannot be done. Compliance with Covid-19 regulations does not permit two people using the same water. Emptying and refilling is impractical and cannot be done quickly. One at a time, our friends will stand in the font and I shall pour water over their heads while saying the words.

All three of our friends will have sponsors with them who assist them in living the commission received from our Lord. Yet it is not just them who have that responsibility. All of us in this local community of the faith are responsible for helping each other come to a deeper and more vibrant faith.

We are delighted to welcome our friends into the full life of the Church. As St Paul says today: nothing can come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord. Let us take this to heart and let others see this belief manifested in all our thoughts words, and deeds. Let us see ourselves as the nourishment given by the Lord to the crowds who sought meaning and direction in their lives. Jesus fed 5,000 plus with the little the disciples gave him. Through us and our commitment to him he does the same.

Our maximum number is still 50 at Sunday mass. If you wish to come, please contact the parish office to leave your contact details.

Newcomers will be allocated a seat. Remaining seats are allocated on drawing names from the sacred hat! Those who celebrated the previous week have one week off. After that, their names return for possible selection. Late each week, the parish will contact those who have a seat. With 5.30 pm mass for the time being, we have been able to welcome all who express an interest in coming.

Mass is live streamed from St Patrick's at 10 am so those allocated a seat are asked to be in the church by 9.30 am.

Fr Adrian acknowledges that this method of seat allocation is clumsy but it is the way to go while complying with the government regulations.

#### FINANCIAL SUPPORT OF THE PARISH

With Sunday masses suspended for the time being, please continue to support the parish financially. The ways to do this are:

**Use the envelopes** and drop them off at the parish office. Those at Mass, can place their offerings in the baskets in front of the altar.

Arrange a direct debit from your financial institution to the parish

**Transfer funds electronically online**. To make these transfers the details to use are: Gympie Parish BSB 064-786 Account Number 6531102 or BSB 064-786 Account Number 100017636.

To make a deposit at a post office or bank branch use these details: BSB o64-ooo Account Number 0032 5284. This is an open account unlike the closed account for electronic transfer.

This is the main account for the Archdiocesan Development Fund (ADF). Ask the staff member you deal with to include an identifier. Experience has shown that some will not accept identifiers (I do not why. Those with banking experience may have an answer.) Staff at the ADF have assured me that even without an identifier they will know which account the deposit goes to. May I suggest you send an email to the parish with details of your deposit – date and amount to ensure our records of your assistance are accurate.


